Registration Details

ELIGIBILITY

The convention is open to all public and private grade school students nationwide. Schools are advised to send student-delegates such as active members of school organizations, officers of the student council, school paper editors and staffers, and honor students. The delegates must: 1) possess leadership capabilities and good academic qualifications; 2) be of good moral character and; 3) be physically fit to participate in the convention activities. Each student delegation must also come with their respective teacher-adviser/s.

CONVENTION FEE

The convention fee is SIX THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY PESOS (Php 6,250.00) per delegate which is inclusive of meals, lodging, convention kit and materials, and other training expenses. Transportation expenses from point of origin to the convention venue are NOT included.

RESERVATION

To secure participation, please fill out the pre-registration form and send it to the CMLI Office on or before August 24, 2017 at 23 Maaralin Street, Brgy. Central Village, Diliman, Quezon City with telefax nos. 924-2304 and 775-0831. ATTIRE AND ID

Delegates are required to wear Filipiniana Attire during the Opening Ceremonies and Formal Attire during the Closing Ceremonies. They are also advised to bring appropriate attire for outdoor and sports activities good for five (5) days (smart casual/semi-formal clothes).

Convention IDs must be worn at all times for the delegate's security. Delegates are not allowed to enter the session hall, mess hall, and other activity areas without their respective IDs.

ACCOMMODATION/BILLETING

The delegates shall be staying at Teachers Camp, Baguio City. Billeting will be on August 31, 2017 from 8:00 AM to 12:00 NN. The venue will be providing beddings for the delegates. All activities will be held at the camp. Meals will be served to the delegates at the mess hall. The CMLI has arranged security measures for the delegates including a 24-hour standby medical staff to respond to any emergencies.

ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS

We also suggest the delegates to bring the following: flashlight, medicine, mosquito repellents, toiletries, first aid kits, pocket money and extra snacks.

GENERAL CONTEST GUIDELINES

The contests are open to all elementary students from both private and public schools, who are registered participants of the 38th Annual Graders' Convention of Junior Members and Teacher-Advisers.

2 All contestants must register during the convention registration hours.

- Sign-up sheets for each contest will be given to each school during the registration. These must be accomplished and passed on or before 11:45 AM. On the spot registration during the contest will not be entertained.
- A delegate may compete in any contest (individual or group), provided that he/she will be able to attend all his/her chosen con test/s during its/their respective schedule. The organizers will stick to the time allotted for each competitions, no adjustments will be made.

Elimination rounds are CLOSED DOOR. Only the contestants are allowed inside the venue, 5.

Final rounds are open assemblies. All delegates and teacher-advisers are invited to watch the different contests. 6

Winners will be announced and awarded in the Awarding and Closing Ceremonies.

The decision of the Board of Judges is FINAL and UNAPPEALABLE.

TALENT VARIETY SHOW

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

Only one (1) group consisting of a minimum of six (6) and a maximum of forty (40) members may represent their school.

Contestants must submit their music in USB form during the Registration on or before 11:45 AM. Note: Kindly label your FLASH DRIVE with track number and name of school (no abbreviation); and bring a CD with a backup file of your music.

Contestants may choose to sing, dance, and act, or do all in a presentation highly relevant and contributory to the theme of the convention.

No previously existing piece is required, though not discouraged. Any form of presentation is permitted. Costumes and props are allowed and HIGHLY RECOMMENDED.

Additional reminders about the competition will be given during the process.

A school must send one (1) teacher representative to attend the contest orientation. This will be held prior to the start of the elimination round.

Entry forms will be given in the registration on August 31, and must be accomplished and passed on or before 11:45 AM on the same day.

ELIMINATION ROUND

The order of presentation will follow the first-come, first-served basis.

Only coaches and/or teacher-advisers of the performing school will be allowed to enter the room during the performance.

The contestants will be given two (2) minutes to prepare the props and backdrops. Should they have remaining preparation time, it cannot be used as additional time for their performance.

The presentations should have a minimum of six (6) and a maximum of eight (8) minutes duration. Time penalties will mean a deduction of 0.1 point to the overall score for every excess to the maximum time or lack to the minimum time of one second. Only five (5) groups will move on to the Grand Finals.

The list of the participants who will qualify to the final round will be posted by the JC-NEB.

Lots will be drawn prior to the said event. It will be used to determine the order of the performances.

The group will be given two (2) minutes to prepare the props and backdrops. Should they have remaining preparation time, it cannot be used as additional time for their performance.

Presentations should have a minimum of six (6) and a maximum of eight (8) minutes durations. Time penalties will mean a deduction of 0.1 point to the over all score for every excess to the maximum time or lack to the minimum time of one second.

Contestants must perform the same routine they performed in the elimination round.

Winners will be announced in the Awarding and Ciosing Ceremonies.

SOLO SINGING

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

Only one (1) representative per school is allowed to join this competition. An alternate representative may also be registered, however, he may replace the representative before the elimination round only.

Each contestant is required to bring the following:

a) Minus-one **USB** with label (Format: Name, School, Song Name)

USB of his/her song (Multiplex is not allowed)

Instrument (If with accompaniment) c)

Back up MP3 file of chosen sing in a CD (Extra Copy) d)

GUIDELINES

Songs that are to be sung in this competition may be of different genres, provided that it is in English or Filipino. (e.g., Pop, Country, Jazz, Rock, etc.)

Medley of songs is strictly PROHIBITED.

Entry forms will be given in the registration day on August 31, and must be accomplished and passed on or before 11:45 AM on the same day.

ELIMINATION ROUND

The order of presentation will follow the first-come, first-served basis.

Contestants are not allowed to watch other competitors' performance during the elimination round.

Contestants must perform a song minimum of three (3) minutes and a maximum five (5) minutes in length. Time penalties will mean a deduction of 0.1 point to the overall score for every excess to the maximum time or lack to the minimum time of one second.

A cappella singing and or using multiple tapes is strictly not allowed. It will lead to the immediate DISQUALIFICATION of the contestant.

Only five (5) contestants will move on to the Final Round.

The list of the contestants who will qualify to the final round will be posted by the JC-NEB.

GRAND FINALS

Lots will be drawn prior to the said event. It will be used to determine the order of the performances.

Finalists are entitled the privileged to change their song entries prior to the grand finals.

Contestants are advised to present their tapes, as well as indicate the track number in their USBs before the competition. 3

Contestants must perform a song minimum of three (3) minutes and a maximum five (5) minutes in length. Time penalties will mean deduction of 0.1 po to the overall score for every excess to the maximum time or lack to the minimum time of one second.

A cappella singing and/or using multiple tapes is strictly not allowed. it will lead to the immediate DISQUALIFICATION of the contestant. 5

Live accompaniment is allowed, provided that the finalist will attend to his/her accompanist's needs (e.g. instruments, pieces, wires, etc.)

Costumes and props are allowed and HIGHLY RECOMMENDED.

Commentaries must submit their music in CD form during the Registration on or before 11:45 AM of August 31. ((Note: Kindly label your USB with track number and name of school (no abbreviation); and kindly bring a back-up file of your music.)

The order of presentation will follow the first-come, first-served basis.

Corrissiants must perform a dance routine minimum of three (3) minutes and a maximum of five (5) minutes in length. Time penalties will mean a dedu of 0.1 point to the overall score for every excess to the maximum time or lack to the minimum time of one (1) second.

Connestants music must be purely Hip Hop (no Jazz, Ballet, Interpretative Dance, etc.). They may mix different hip hop songs as long as it fits required time of performance.

Break dance and stunts are permitted. Exhibitions that are too risky and may cause harm are discouraged.

The list of the participants who will qualify to the final round will be posted by the JC-NEB.

GRAND FINALS

Lots will be drawn prior to the said event. It will be used to determine the order of the performances.

MINI ME

A. ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

Only one (1) contestants may represent a school.

They must impersonate a notable famous character (whether local or foreign) who excelled in his/her own field. (e.g. Lea Salonga, Theater). The
organizers strongly recommend personalities who exude values that can be an inspiration to the Filipino youth.

Contestants should prepare their own character portrayal piece. It should be composed of an introduction inclusive of a famous dialogue/quotation of the chosen notable local or foreign character to be followed by a performance and/or a talent portion. (e.g. Lea Salonga, Theatrical Singing.) Contestants may use either ENGLISH or FILIPINO as their medium.

Use of costume, props and other materials needed for the performance is required.

5. Contestants must memorize their script. They are not allowed to bring or read their script during the performance.

Contestants are required to submit a 3 x 5 photo of heir chosen local or foreign character.

ELIMINATION ROUND

The order of presentation will follow the first-come, first-served basis.

Contestants are given a total time of three (3) and a maximum of (5) minutes to perform their character portrayal pieces. Time penalties will mean a
deduction of 0.1 point to the total score for every excess to the maximum time or lack to the minimum time of one second.

3. Five (5) contestants will move on to the Grand Finals.

The list of the participants who will qualify to the final round will be posted.

GRAND FINALS

Lots will be drawn prior to the said event. It will be used to determine the order of the presentation.

Contestants are given a minimum of three (3) minutes and a maximum of five (5) minutes to perform. Time penalties will mean a deduction of 0.1 point to

MR. & MS. GRADERS CONVENTION

A. ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

1. Only two (2) contestants may represent a school, one (1) male representative and one (1) female representative.

B. GUIDELINES

1. Registration sheets must be submitted during the convention's registration hours (August 31, at 8:00 AM to 11:45 AM)

There will be no elimination round.

3. There will be an orientation and costume check for the contestants and the teacher-advisers regarding the rules and guidelines of the contest on the same day.

There will also be no talent portion.

5. Contestants are required to bring two (2) attires:

a. One (1) Casual Outfit (for catwalk)

b. One (1) Formal or Evening Attire (for the evening attire walk and Question and Answer)

*Formal or Evening Attire pertains to long gown (Female) and suit and tie (Male). Denim pants will not be considered as a formal attire.

Note: The use of excessive and flamboyant costumes (such as wings, headdresses, staff, ball gowns, back drapes) is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

Contestants are required to submit a description of their evening attire which will be read during the well. (FORMAT foot in 12 Trans New Pares Little Which

- Contestants are required to submit a description of their evening attire which will be read during the walk. (FORMAT: font size 12, Times New Roman, letter/short bond, no more than 80 words). This will be collected during the orientation/costume check.
- Entry forms will be given in the registration on August 31, and must be accomplished and passed on or before 11:45 AM on the same day.
 Contestants whose props and costume that will exceed seventy-two (72) inches in height from the ground and/or thirty (30) inches in width will be DISQUALIFIED.
