## PROJECT PROPOSAL

## INTER-HIGH SCHOOL JUNIOR LIS WIZARD

### I. General Rules and Eligibility

- a. Open to all bona fide public and private high school students
  - i. Every participating school may send up to three (3) teams consisting of two (2) students per team.
  - ii. Names of participants should be sent to the organizers **not later than February 20, 2017**. Register at <http://tinyurl.com/JrLISWizard>.
  - iii. Every student must wear his or her school uniform during the contest proper to represent the school properly.
  - iv. In case a regular member of a participating team fails to come, the alternate shall be allowed to compete only in the condition that the coach/adviser must approach the organizers immediately before or on the registration proper regarding the changes.
  - iv. All participants, coach/adviser included, **must attend the LibSpeak 2017: Connecting the Gap** conference and must be on the venue on or before the said call time to be entitled to join in the contest.
  - v. All students participating in the other contests (i.e. Poster Making Contest and Extemporaneous Speech Contest) are automatically disqualified from participating in this event.
- b. A **registration fee of P100** shall be collected for every participant.

### II. Contest Rules

#### **Elimination Round**

- a. The registration proper will be on February 27, 2017 at City College of Angeles from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM. The contest proper will start at exactly 10:00 AM and will end at 12:00 PM. Late participants will not be entertained. Participants should present their school ID upon registration.
- b. No reference materials, coaches, advisers or students shall be allowed within the contest area.
- c. Students caught cheating will automatically be disqualified.
- d. The elimination will be administered in a written-type of exam. Use blue or black pen only.
- e. The coverage will involve big events of 2016, general information and general knowledge about the library.
- f. Question will be taken from publications chosen by the organizers published from October 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016.
- g. Participants will be given two (2) hours to finish the exam. They may opt to finish earlier than the given time, but all participants shall stay in the contest area until 12 PM or after everyone is done.
- h. The scores of the two students per team will be added. The top ten (10) teams will proceed to the final round.
- i. Finalists will be announced before the start of the final round.
- J All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- k. In case there are fifteen (15) or below participating teams then there will be no elimination round.
- l. The announcement of winners and awarding of prizes will be held during the Closing Ceremony.

#### **Final Round**

- a. This will be held on February 27, 2016, from 3:00 PM to 4:15 PM. If no elimination round happens, the contest will still start from 3:00 PM to 4:15 PM.



- b. No reference materials, coaches, advisers or students shall be allowed within the contest area.
- c. Late participants will not be able to join the final round.
- d. Students caught cheating will automatically be disqualified.
- d. Questions will involve big events of 2016, general information and general knowledge about the Library and Information Science.
- e. Questions will be taken from publications chosen by the organizers published from January 1, 2016 to January 31, 2017.
- f. The final round will be a team quiz bee type competition.
- g. There will be three (3) rounds: Easy, Average and Difficult. Contestants will be given five (5) seconds for the Easy Round, ten (10) seconds for the Average Round and fifteen (15) seconds for the Difficult Round to answer each question. The said rounds will merit one (1) point, two (2) points and three (3) points respectively.
- h. The question will be read twice by the quizmaster. The signal "GO" indicates that the contestants should choose their answers and the signal "STOP" requires them to raise their answer/letter boards.
- i. Any questions or clarifications should be raised before the next question is read. The decision of the judges will be final and irrevocable.
- j. Scores of each round will be added. The three (3) teams with the highest scores will be declared champion, first runner-up and second-up respectively.
- k. In case of a tie, five (5) questions will be asked to break the tie. Fifteen (15) seconds will be allotted for answering each question.
- l. The school of the winning team will be entitled with free registration fee for the next LibSpeak's Inter-High School Junior LIS Wizard.
- m. The announcement of winners and awarding of prizes will be held during the Closing Ceremony.

## INTER-HIGH SCHOOL ON-THE-SPOT POSTER MAKING CONTEST

### I. General Rules and Eligibility

- a. Open to all bona fide public and private high school students
  - i. Every participating school may send up to three (3) participants.
  - ii. Names of participants should be sent to the organizers **not later than February 20, 2017**. Register at <http://tinyurl.com/PosterMakingCon>.
  - iii. Every student must wear his or her school uniform during the contest proper to represent the school properly.
  - iv. All participants, coach included, **must attend the LibSpeak 2017: Connecting the Gap** conference and must be on the venue on or before the said call time to be entitled to join in the contest.
  - v. All students participating in the other contests (i.e. Junior LIS Wizard, and Photography Contest) are automatically disqualified from participating in this event.
- b. A **registration fee of P100** shall be collected for every participant.

### II. Contest Rules

- a. The registration proper will be on February 27, 2017 at City College of Angeles from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM. The contest proper will start at exactly 10:00 AM and will end at 12:00 PM. Late participants will not be entertained. Participants should present their school ID upon registration.
- b. Mentors, coaches, teachers, and parents will not be allowed to assist or remain near the participants during the contest proper.
- c. The poster should be an artistic interpretation of the theme which will be announced on the contest proper.
- d. The poster must be done with a portrait orientation on a 20" x 30" illustration board provided by the organizers.
- e. Participants can use acrylic, colored pencils, charcoal, craypass, pastels, watercolors, or any combination of these media. Participants are required to bring their own art materials.
- f. Participants will be given two (2) hours to accomplish their work. They may opt to finish earlier than the given time, but exceeding the time limit will incur a violation.
- g. As for the identification of the entries, only the number assigned to the participants should appear on their final work.
- h. Any hint or mention of the name, school, or any form of identification in the entry per se, unless deemed necessary by the board of judges, shall be considered a violation.
- i. Any violation of the rules is equivalent to a 2-point deduction from the final score, for each rule violated.
- j. All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- k. The top three (3) entries will be chosen by the judges. Their decision is final and irrevocable.
- l. The announcement of winners and awarding of prizes will be held during the Closing Ceremony.
- m. The participants can take their works with them after the event.

## INTER-HIGH SCHOOL EXTEMPORANEOUS SPEECH CONTEST

### I. General Rules and Eligibility

- a. Open to **all bona fide public** and private high school students
  - i. Every **participating** school may send up to three (3) participants.
  - ii. Names of participants should be sent to the organizers **not later than February 20, 2017**. Register at <http://tinyurl.com/ExtempoSpeechCon>.
  - iii. Every student must wear his or her school uniform during the contest proper to represent the school properly.
  - iv. All participants, coach included, **must attend the LibSpeak 2017: Connecting the Gap** conference and must be on the venue on or before the said call time to be entitled to join in the contest.
  - v. All students participating in the other contests (i.e. Junior LIS Wizard, and Photography Contest) are automatically disqualified from participating in this event.
- b. A **registration fee of P100** shall be collected for every participant.

### II. Contest Rules

- a. The registration proper will be on February 27, 2017 at City College of Angeles from 7:30 AM to 9:00 AM. The contest proper will start at exactly 10:00 AM and will end at 12:00 PM. Late participants will not be entertained. Participants should present their school ID upon registration.
- b. The organizers will conduct random selection/draw lots to determine the sequence of turns of the participants.
- c. Mentors, coaches, teachers, and parents will not be allowed to assist or remain near the waiting area of the participants
- d. Every participant will be given two (2) minutes of preparation and three (3) minutes for his or her speech.
- e. The speech shall be in line with the theme which will be announced on the contest proper.
- f. Participants who shall finish earlier than the time limit shall incur deduction of points. Every thirty (30) seconds is equivalent to a 2-point deduction from the final score.
- g. Time will be checked thoroughly. Boards will be raised to inform the participant of his or her time.
- h. The speech shall be delivered in either English or Filipino. If a participant opts to use the former language, he or she cannot use the latter, and vice versa. Every violation of this rule is equivalent to a 1-point deduction from the final score.
- i. The style of the delivery shall be conversational, oratorical or a combination of both.
- j. Use of sound effects, microphones and props is strictly prohibited
- k. All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- l. The top three (3) entries will be chosen by the judges. Their decision is final and irrevocable.
- m. The announcement of winners and awarding of prizes will be held during the Closing Ceremony.
