

Dr. Rito Baring is Full Professor of the Theology and Religious Education Department of De la Salle University (DLSU) in Manila. He earned his Master's and Doctorate degrees in Education major in Religious and Values Education from DLSU in 1998 and 2006 respectively. He served in various positions as Graduate programs coordinator and the Chair of the Theology and Religious Education Department of DLSU. He also served as Program Director of the Lasallian Catechetical Center. He is involved in the training of teachers and graduate students in the Philippines for research and publication, values education, youth studies and pedagogy. As a scholar, his research interests include Empirical Theology, Religious Education, Christian Spirituality, and Youth Studies. He contributes to scholarship in these areas, by publishing in refereed and abstracted/indexed (ISI/Scopus-listed) international Journals. He is a member of the Religious Education Association based in the U.S. and the International Society of Empirical Research in Theology (ISERT) in Europe. He is also a peer reviewer for the Journal of Youth Studies, The International Journal of Children's Spirituality and Young Journal among others. He edited an anthology entitled, "Studies in Religion and theology: issues and perspectives" released in 2011. Recently, he co-authored a book chapter published by Springer Publishing (Switzerland) entitled "Contemporary engagements and challenges for Catholic Religious Education in Southeast Asia" (co-authored with Rebecca Cacho) bearing the book title "Global Perspectives on Catholic Religious Education in Schools". Another book chapter under Springer is in the pipeline on the Youth and the Sacred. He is currently working on an externally funded project under the United Board for Christian Higher Education based on




The participants to this activity are grades 6 & 10 winners/champions during the division elimination rounds. They shall bring their breakfast, snacks and lunch.

DepEd MEMORANDUM No. 22

2017 METROBANK-MTAP-DEPED MATH CHALLENGE

To: Bureau Directors Regional Directors Schools Division Superintendents Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools Heads All Others Concerned

- On its 16th year of nationwide Competition, the Metrobank Foundation Inc. (MBFI), the Mathematics Teachers Association of the Philippines (MTAP), and the Department of Education (DepEd) will hold the 2017 Metrobank-MTAP-DepEd Math Challenge (MMC) from January to March 2017.
- The overall objective of the Competition is to contribute in improving the quality of Mathematics Education in the Philippines through the following:
 - a. awakening greater interest in Mathematics among elementary and secondary school learners;
 - b. encouraging them to strive for excellence in Mathematics;
 - c. discovering mathematical talents among them;
 - d. developing the values of hardwork, perseverance, honesty, teamwork, and sportsmanship; and
 - e. providing them with opportunities in leadership and cooperative. undertaking.
- The Elimination and Schools Division Level Competition will be participated in by elementary and secondary school learners nationwide. However, only Grades 6 and 10 learners can participate in the Regional and National Finals. All public and private schools are required to submit the MMC Form No. 1 contained in Enclosure No. 5 to the schools division office (SDO) for registration. The Mathematics supervisor with the MMC online portal account should send the MMC Form No. 2 through an online portal, its instruction provided in Enclosure No. 4. The Contest Mechanics are contained in Enclosure No. 3.
- Division Mathematics supervisors shall be in-charge of the preparation, implementation, and documentation of the Elimination and Schools Division Finals Competition, including preparation of the program and fielding of qualified officials to serve as judges, proctors, and hosts/quizmasters. They will also be responsible for settling all questions, including protests, which may arise in the course of the Competition. A panel of advisers shall also be formed by the schools division superintendent to address the questions during the Competition. For security and for purposes of maintaining the confidentiality of the test questions, the turn-over of the test materials will be documented and all packages in the different stages of the Competition will be opened simultaneously at 8:00 a.m. on the date of the Competition. All concerned are required to carefully read the MMC Document No. 2 for the Operating Guidelines provided in Enclosure No. 2, as new policies are strictly implemented, and the Primer provided in Enclosure No. 1.

- 5. For the **Regional Finals**, the Regional Mathematics supervisor shall be in-charge of the preparation, implementation, and documentation, including preparation of the program, designation of judges, proctors, correctors for the individual competition, and hosts/quizmasters. He/She will also be responsible for settling all questions, including protests, which may arise in the course of the Competition.
- 6. Representatives from MTAP will assist in facilitating this stage of the Competition, both in the individual and team competitions.
- 7. For the **National Finals**, the following are the qualifications in determining the ten National Finalists for both individual and team competitions at the elementary and secondary schools levels:
 - Top scorers for both Categories A and B in the National Capital Region (NCR);
 - b. Top scorer in each geographical area (the rest of Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao); and
 - c. Remaining five top scorers across all regions.
- 8. All DepEd officials, including school heads (SHs) and Mathematics teachers, are requested to actively campaign and to enjoin support for the Competition of all public and private schools nationwide to ensure maximum participation.
- 9. The participating parties shall shoulder expenses from the Elimination Round to the Regional Level Competition. Participants from private schools shall make necessary arrangements for their expenses with their SHs. At the National Level Competition, the MBFI will finance the transportation expenses, accommodation, and meal allowance of the national finalists and their coaches. MBFI shall also provide the awards for the winners from the Schools Division Finals (medals) to the Regional and National Finals (cash prizes, medals, and trophies) as well as cash incentives for the coaches of regional and national finalists.
- 10. The enclosed documents and forms (Enclosure Nos. 1 to 5) may also be downloaded either from www. mbfoundation.org or www.facebook.com/MetrobankMathChallenge.
- 11. Separate guidelines will be issued for the NCR Competitions.
- 12. In case of conflict in schedule with other DepEd activities, the schools division and regional offices are advised to assign appropriate persons to administer the tests at the schools division and/or regional levels on the scheduled dates. As agreed upon by the MMC National Steering Committee, conduct of the contest other than the schedule below is not allowed:

Elimination Round : February 16, 2017 (Elementary Level)

February 17, 2017 (High School Level)

• Finals Division : March 16, 2017 (Elementary Level)

March 17, 2017 (High School Level)

Regional Finals
 March 31, 2017 (Individual and Team Competitions)
 National Finals
 April 21, 2017 (Individual Written Examination)

April 22, 2017 (Individual and Team Oral Competitions)

13. Arrangements for substitute teachers must be made to ensure that the classes of the participating teacher-coaches will not be disrupted.
