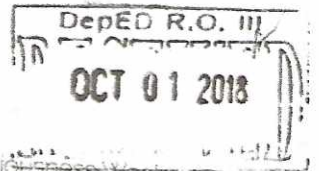

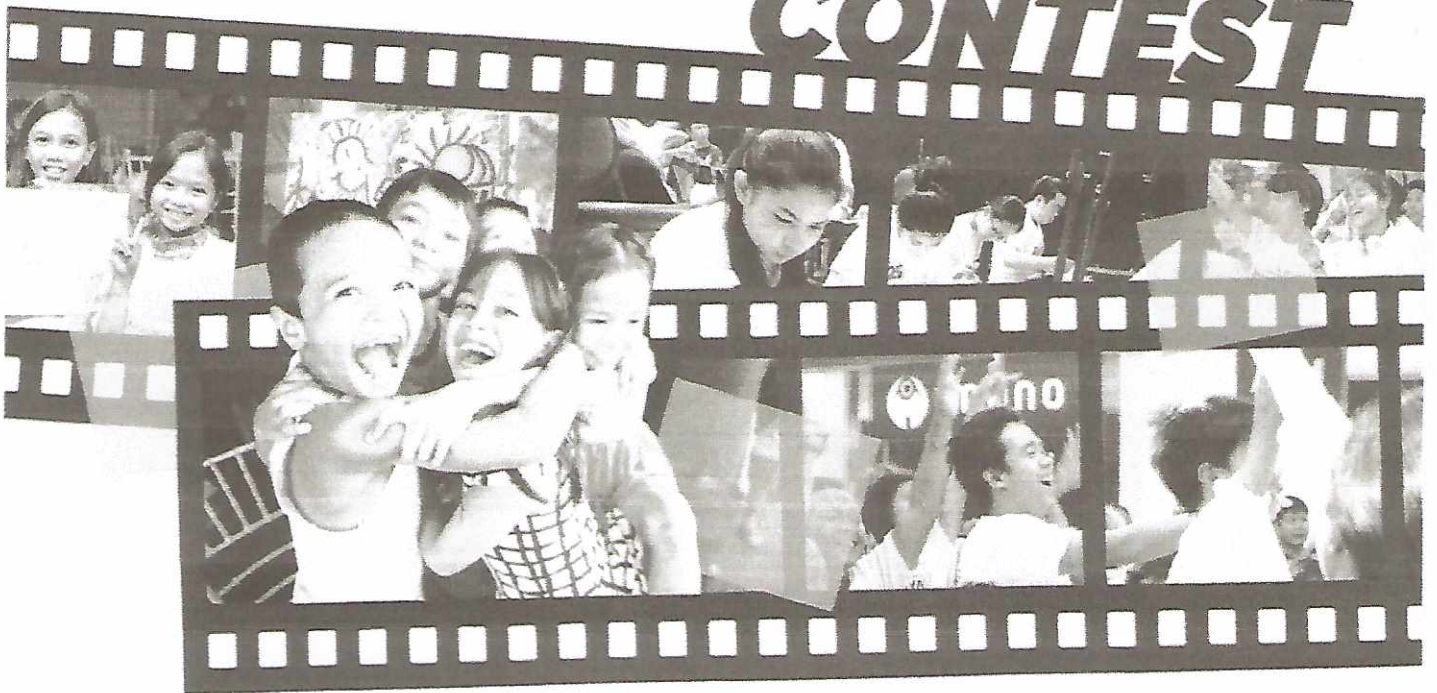

MECHANICS AND CRITERIA

7th Juvenile Justice and Welfare Consciousness Week (JJWeek)

#ProgressForChildren Photo Contest

A. Objectives

The **#ProgressForChildren Photo Contest** aims to showcase talents of young student-photographers to demonstrate children and young people's perspective on the concept of a united community that works for the protection and welfare of their children.

Through this competition, the JJWC aims:

1. To promote innovative, responsive and sustainable practices of communities or LGUs in ensuring that rights and welfare of their children are protected;
2. To exhibit a collection of photographs that depict progress in communities that works for children and their family;
3. To help raise and increase awareness on the roles of the community to promote the welfare of all children; and
4. To use the submitted photos as additional educational tools for future advocacy activities.

B. Mechanics

1. The **#ProgressForChildren Photo Contest** is open to all children and youth aged 12-17 years old who are enrolled in any public or private schools and alternative learning centers within National Capital Region (NCR), CALABARZON and Region III.
2. The theme of the photo contest shall be: **Progress that works for children.**
3. Submission of entries is through online. Photos should be sent to acd.jjwc@gmail.com with the e-mail subject: **#ProgressForChildren Photo Contest**
4. The following information shall be provided upon sending of entry:

- Year it was taken
- Complete name of photographer
- Age
- Contact numbers (landline/mobile phone)
- Complete residential address
- Name of school/college/center
- Address and contact numbers of school/college/center

Important: attach present and valid school ID bearing the contestant's name and birth date

5. The following specifications shall be maintained:

- Photo size may be 8 x 10, 8 x 12, 36 x 48, or 72 x 96 inches with minimum requirement of 300 dpi resolution
- Photographer may use any type and brand of *Digital SLR camera, Mirrorless Camera and Point and Shoot Camera* as long as it can produce HD quality images
- Photo orientation may be portrait or landscape
- Photo submitted may be in jpeg file only
- Photos may be in colored and/or black and white
- Photo manipulation/editing is allowed but limited to minor adjustments only (cropping, exposure level adjustment, saturation, and color balance)
- Photos may be cropped or rotated as necessary for photographer's creative preference but shall not violate the above-mentioned orientation and size
- No other identifying marks (e.g. watermark, etc.) shall appear on the submitted photos
- No elements shall be added or replaced in the composition

6. An individual may submit up to three (3) entries but may only win once.

7. Photos must neither be previously submitted to any other competitions, local or international, nor published in any printed or electronic media.

8. All photos submitted shall be the property of the JJWC and may be used for other educational and advocacy activities, with appropriate credits to the photographer.

9. Deadline of submission of entries shall be on **November 5, 2018 at 6:00 p.m.**

10. Awarding of winners shall be on the Culminating Event of the 7th JJWeek on **November 29, 2018.**

11. Prizes shall be:

1st Place – plaque + Php 10,000.00

2nd Place – plaque + Php 7,000.00

3rd Place – plaque + Php 5,000.00

C. Criteria for Judging

All photos will be judged based on the following criteria:

- Relevance to the theme – 40%
- Composition – 40%
- Creativity – 10%
- Originality – 10%
