Greetings!

The History Department of the University of Asia and the Pacific (UA&P) cordially invites you to a seminar-workshop on "Rizal's Ideas on Citizenship in Noli Me Tangere and El Filibusterismo." Our activity will be held on April 25-27, 2018 (Wednesday to Friday) at the Telengtan Hall, University of Asia and the Pacific campus, Pearl Drive, Ortigas Center, Pasig City.

This will be the the third seminar-workshop in our three-year series on "Teaching Rizal's *Noli Me Tangere* and *El Filibusterismo* for Wisdom and Citizenship in the K to 12 Curriculum." The first seminar-workshops was held successfully in April 2016 and the second one in April 2017. The first one focused on the 'Historical Context Behind Rizal's Noli Me Tangere and El Filibusterismo,' while the second one delved deeply into the 'Life of Rizal During the Writing of His Two Novels.'

For April 2018, our seminar-workshop will be relevant to the Filipino teachers for Grades 7 to 10 and also to Social Studies teachers for Grades 4 and 5. In general, it will be beneficial to all who teach Philippine History as well as the two novels of our national hero – the *Noli Me Tangere and El Filibusterismo*. The objectives of the seminar-workshop are:

- To develop correct and deeper understanding of the historical background behind Rizal's novels in order for teachers to have strong and integral understanding of historical concepts, themes, and issues in history and historiography;
- 2. To demonstrate some of the best practices in teaching approaches and assessment tools used in these subjects; and
- 3. To illustrate how the learners can use critical analysis, academic reasoning, and practice responsible citizenship and civic virtues.

Esteemed Rizal Awardee, Dr. Paul A. Dumol will head the seminar, together with equally respected and highly qualified professors from the University of Asia and the Pacific and from the University of the Philippines (Diliman), namely Dr. Clement C. Camposano, Dr. Arnel E. Joven and Dr. Marya Svetlana T. Camacho.

To conclude our event, Palanca Award winner, Dr. Joachim Emilio B. Antonio will stage "Romance and Revolution." A Play on Jose Rizal in Dapitan", highlighting the contributions of our national hero to the making of the ideal Filipino. Additionally, the play itself is already a teaching tool that the participants can bring to their respective schools as surely, students are always excited about staging theater productions. Given this, it truly is a promising learning experience.

Greetings!

The Philosophy Department of the University of Asia and the Pacific invites you to a seminar-workshop on *Teaching Philosophy of the Human Person and Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao in the K to 12 Curriculum*. This year's seminar-workshop will cover the following topics: *Person and the Common Good, Development of Human Sexuality and Gender Identity, Family and Society*. The activity will be held on April 10-12, 2018 at the Telengtan Hall, APEC Communications Building, University of Asia and the Pacific, Ortigas Center, Pasig City.

This seminar-workshop is the third in the three-year series on Teaching Philosophy of the Human Person and Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao in the K to 12 Curriculum. The previous seminar-workshops focused on the fundamentals of the human person (Understanding the Self, The Emotional Self, and Managing the Self in Freedom) and morality (Foundations of Morality, Conscience and Moral Reasoning & Virtues and Character Formation).

The seminar-workshop will be relevant to the teachers of Edukasyon sa Pagpapakatao (ESP) and Introduction to the Philosophy of the Human Person as well as those teaching related subjects. The objectives of the seminar-workshop are as follows:

- 1. To help the participants appreciate the relevance of the Philosophy of the Human Person and Ethics in the early education of students.
- 2. To help the participants reinforce their understanding of the foundations of morality, moral reasoning and virtues and character formation.
- 3. To share with the participants some of the best practices concerning teaching approaches and assessment tools used in Philosophy of the Human Person and Ethics.
- 4. To help the teachers generate complementary skills among the students in the study of Philosophy of the Human Person and Ethics, such as critical thinking, moral reasoning, and virtuous behavior.

The resource persons are highly esteemed faculty members of the University and are experts in their respective fields. The members of the Philosophy department will also be present to facilitate the workshops after each presentation.

The seminar-workshop fee is four thousand pesos, (PHP 4,000) to cover lunch and snacks, materials, certificates and other incidental expenses for the three-day activity. Early bird registration is PHP 3,500 (must be paid in full on or before March 9, 2018). Accommodations are NOT included. A list of recommended nearby places is available on our website.


