The Holy Angel University Center for Kapampangan Studies has produced its second Kapampangan indie film entitled *ARIA*, about a woman fighting for something all her life: first, as a pre-war zarzuela star fighting for love, then as a HUKBALAHAP guerrilla fighting for her nation's liberation, and finally, as a 94-year old war veteran fighting to have her discontinued pension restored. *Aria* is a historical movie with Kapampangan dialogue and English subtitles. The film is a tribute to all HUKBALAHAP guerrillas who sacrificed their life and personal happiness but never got the same recognition and appreciation that soldiers got from government. It is classified "PG" (Parental Guidance) by the Movie and Television Review and Classification Board (MTRCB), that is, underage students can watch it provided they are accompanied by a parent or a faculty member. SYNOPSIS:

A musical-theatre actress falls for a Communist ideologue in the Philippine countryside during the golden years before World War II. The outbreak of war separates them and suspends their campaign for social reform. They run into each other in the resistance movement, where the actress has become a performer in the movement's propaganda unit and the ideologue an armed guerrilla in its military unit. As the war deepens, she outgrows her passive role in the resistance and yearns to participate in actual combat, until a mysterious female bandit shows up and lures her into joining her rogue group.

The story is told in flashbacks from the point of view of a war veteran who has been deprived of her monthly pension due to a bureaucratic snag.

LOGLINE:

Aria is the sad song of one woman's personal struggle for freedom echoing an entire nation's fight for liberation.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT:

After telling the charming little story of friendship between Pampanga's king of poets and a young boy in *Ari: My Life with a King*, producer/screenwriter Sir Robby Tantingco offered me another Kapampangan story that, according to him, needed to be told to the world: the story of

Indang Pining, a 94-year-old war veteran who was a pre-war zarzuela actress who joined the HUKBALAHAP (Hukbong Bayan Laban sa Hapon). She was one of the many unsung heroes who fought to liberate our country during the Japanese Occupation. What makes her story so compelling to me is, despite her old age, she never stopped fighting for the right reasons. I was moved by how passionately Sir Robby told the story and how proud he was of the patriotism of our Huk guerrillas who are the unsung, undervalued heroes of World War II. I realized how important and necessary these stories are today—stories that inspire us to stand up and do something for the things that truly matter in life, like freedom and love.

Directing the film has proven to be more difficult than I had expected it to be but in the end, the whole experience has taught me to be more understanding, more appreciative, and braver to fight for the things I truly believe in. I can say that *Aria* has been one of the most challenging movies I have done so far but because of the kindness of many people I'm happy to say that it was all worth it, especially after seeing the finished product.
