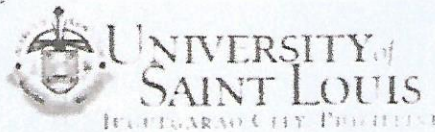



In line with this, we would like to request for the endorsement of the said conference in





CALL FOR PAPER PRESENTATION

Guidelines for the Submission of ABSTRACT

1. An abstract of not more than 250 words must be submitted to irpo-csilker@usl.edu.ph in MSWORD format.
2. Use Arial font style in all parts, single space.
3. It should also include the following:
 - a. Title of the Study
 - b. Author/s
 - c. Name of the Institution
 - d. The name of the person to present should be underlined/highlighted.
 - e. 3-5 keywords.
4. All research abstracts must be submitted not later than December 15, 2019. Notification of acceptance will be issued on December 30, 2019 or earlier.
5. Those whose papers are accepted for presentation will have 20 minutes to present the paper.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR PAPER PRESENTATIONS

1. Each paper presenter is given 20 minutes for the presentation.
2. The Organizing Committee will give a unified PowerPoint template to be used by all Research presenters.
3. The floor for paper presentation will be equipped with laptop and LCD projector.
4. The presentation will include the following:
 - a. Complete Title
 - b. Author/s and co-author's name

- c. Institutional affiliation
 - d. Background and Purpose
 - e. Framework/Plan of Action
 - f. Methodology
 - g. Major Results
 - h. Conclusion
 - i. Recommendations and Implications
 - j. References (Optional)
5. The paper presenter will be informed if he/she has 5 minutes left and if he/she needs to wrap up and stop the presentation due to time allotment given to each presenter.
 6. Recording of sessions by videos is prohibited. However, photography is acceptable.
 7. Certificates of recognition will be awarded at the end of the parallel session.

CALL FOR PANEL DISCUSSION

1. Research papers from those who would like to be part of the panel discussion are welcomed. The papers must address any of the topics falling within the scope of the conference themes:
 - a. Local Knowledge Promotion in Schools
 - b. Indigenous Peoples Education (IPEd) in Basic and Higher Education
 - c. Status of Local languages in the Philippines
 - d. Research and Extension and Local Knowledge
 - e. Indigenous Peoples and the IPRA
 - f. Internationalization and Indigenization of Education
2. Panel Discussion sessions will be 30 minutes. Each presentation will be a total of 30 minutes (20 minute presentation with 10 minutes questions).
3. Panel Discussion proposals must be submitted by the Discussion leader on behalf of all speakers. Proposals must include a summary overview of the panel discussion. This should include:
 - a. Title of the proposed panel
 - b. Names and full addresses, and contact details, as well as a brief description of the panel chair's and panelists' experience and background in the panel topic.
 - c. A brief description of the panel topic and goals, its relevance to Local Knowledge and significance for the research field. The description should also contain the issues to be discussed and a selection of possible pro and con arguments where applicable.
4. The floor for paper presentation will be equipped with laptop and LCD projector.
5. Speakers will be informed if they have 5 minutes left and if they need to wrap up and stop the presentation due to time allotment given.
6. Recording of sessions by videos is prohibited. However, photography is acceptable.
7. Certificates of recognition will be awarded at the end of the panel discussion.
