

We are pleased to announce that the 34th Junior and Senior Regional Camp will be held on March 7-10, 2019 at Central Luzon Regional Program and Training Center, Bamban, Tarlac. The theme is "BE PREPARED: Girl Scouts in Action".

PARTICIPANTS:

3 Patrols of Junior Girls or more

3 Patrols of Senior Girls or more

6-8 girls per patrol

1 Troop Leader per patrol

PAYMENT OF REGISTRATION FEES OF CAMPERS:

a. The camp fee is One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) per camper inclusive of program materials, camp souvenirs other incidental expenses during the camp.

Please take note that food provision is not included in the camp fee.

QUALIFICATION OF THE PARTICIPANTS:

- 1. Must be a registered Junior/Senior Girl Scout.
- 2. Must be physically fit and alert.
- 3. Must have earned at least one badge each under the 8-Point Challenge.
- 4. Must have attended a troop/patrol/council/regional camp prior to this encampment.

FOOD MANAGEMENT:

- 1. The food of the campers is **NOT** included in the registration fee.
- Campers are expected to prepare and cook their own meals in camp based on the proposed menu to be sent in advance to their respective councils.
- 3. There will be a Trading Post inside the camp where the campers can order and buy their marketing needs. Procedures on how to order and purchase perishable goods/food supplies will be discussed by the Sub-Camp Quarter Master during the orientation.
- 4. Campers should bring their individual eating and cooking utensils for each patrol.

GADGET WOOD:

- 1. Gadget woods will be made available for sale at the Trading Post for only P 450.00 each.
- 2. Campers should bring their own twines or straw for lashing.

TENTS:

1. A patrol tent (good for 8 girls) is highly suggested for a better camp lay-out.

THINGS TO BRING:

These should be brought by the individual camper and packed in a duffle bag and a backpack/knapsack provided with luggage tags. Campers are encouraged to travel light, and bring only what is needed.

Personal Things:

Patrol Equipment

Cooking utensils	Stove (charcoal or LPG)
Bolo/trowel	Cleaning materials (detergent, walis tingting, pails and dippers)
First Aid kit	Kerosene lantern/emergency lamp for Quarters, dining and kitchen
Plastic black bags (large) for litters for the encampment duration	

LIST OF CAMPERS:

Submission of the list of campers and accomplished Application form (see attachments) is on or before February 16, 2019 to give us an ample time to prepare.

Other details of the event will be announced in the succeeding circulars. Meanwhile, we suggest that participants to the event be screened and be given the needed preparation during the pre-camp training.
