CALL FOR RESEARCH PAPERS AND LESSON DEMONSTRATIONS

APNIEVE Philippines announces its 18th Annual Convention with the theme "Effective School Leadership for the 21st Century: Meeting Sustainable Development Goals for Peace, Human Rights, Democracy, Gender Equity and Sustainable Development."

Traditionally, APNIEVE adapts the theme of the UNESCO-Asia Pacific Programme of Educational Innovation for Development (APEID) held the year before. Thus, this year's APNIEVE Convention is guided by the theme of the 19th UNESCO-APEID International Conference in Bangkok, November 7-9, 2018 (<https://bangkok.unesco.org/content/19th-unesco-apeid-international-conference>).

Often serving as the links that connect external development and demands with internal school processes and outcomes, school leaders can be highly stressed and overburdened. With limited resources, they face serious challenges in meeting their school's educational goals."

Thus, this year's APNIEVE Convention will focus on the link between theory and practice in school leadership and competencies of educators towards leadership in the classroom, school, community and beyond, within the context of values education and international education.

III. Strengthening School Leadership and Collaboration

- Developing indicators, approaches and tools for assessing school leadership
- Exploring diverse models for strengthening school leadership performance
- Supporting collaborative research on school leadership
- Harnessing the use of technology for communication and dialogues on school leadership

The subthemes revolve around the leading-edge thinking about the school leadership; innovative approaches and practices, and the assessment, monitoring and evaluation of school leadership; and the gaps where more research and efforts are needed in school leadership. These subthemes are situated within the context of APNIEVE's twin thrusts: values education and international education, and the core values of peace, human rights, democracy, gender equity, and sustainable development, in order to achieve inclusive and quality education by 2030.

Presentations will focus around basic research, applied research, best practices, and module/lesson demonstrations.
