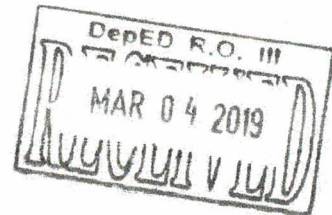

The Saceda Youth Lead (SYL) will conduct the 2019 National Summer Leadership Camp (NSLC) on the following dates with respective venues:

The camp aims to enable the participants to:

1. define leadership and leadership development;
2. enumerate the elements of team effectiveness;
3. define whether a leader is born or made;
4. provide them with opportunities to assist in the community service programs of the local government unit agencies like *Operation Tuli*, Clean Up Drive along river banks and coasts, feeding the less fortunate, or visitation of the inmates of the provincial/city jails;
5. challenge them to hurdle 23 obstacle courses in each city leg for their team building activities; and
6. demonstrate how they actualize leadership theories in practice through series of programs and events during the NSLC.
