

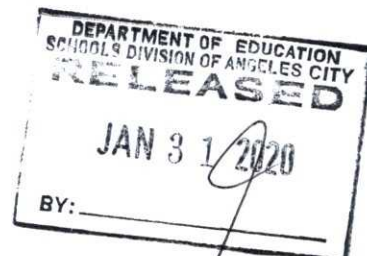

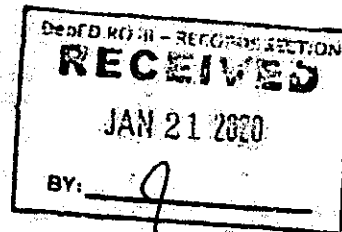

The Asia Pacific Network for International and Values Education (APNIEVE-Philippines) will have its 19th National Convention and Teacher-Training Workshop on April 22-24, 2020 at Philippine Women's College Davao, Davao City. 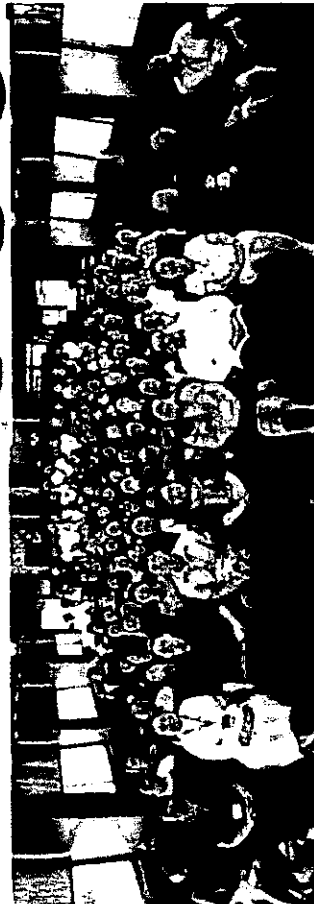
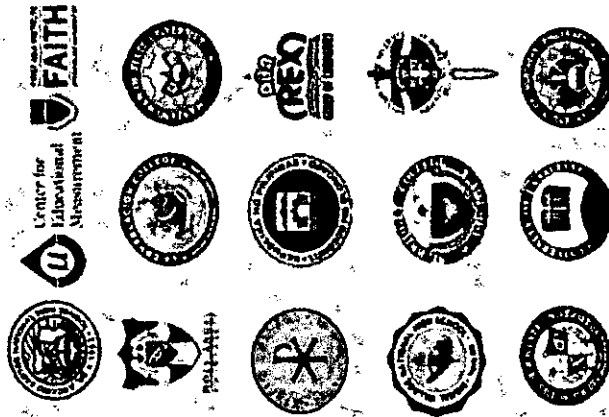

BACKGROUND AND HISTORY

UNESCO APNIEVE was established in March 1995 in Seoul, Korea as a response of Asia Pacific Member States of UNESCO to the 1994 Geneva Declaration and Framework of Action on Education for Peace, Human Rights, and Democracy, adopted by the UNESCO General Conference in Paris, 1995.

The network was founded by a group of eight experts from Australia, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Thailand. It is governed by a set of statutes drawn by the founders and managed by a Steering Committee. Its founding President was Dr. Lourdes R. Qulsumbing.

It conducts a regional activities and meetings and holds a General Membership meeting once in two years in one of the Member States where general elections of officers are held.

APNIEVE-Philippines was founded by Dr. Lourdes R. Qulsumbing and is the most active among the regional chapters in the Asia Pacific region.

It seeks to extend this collaboration with other institutions in activities like:

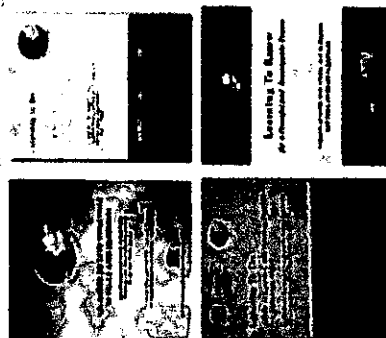
- research and the teaching of international education and values education

APNIEVE SOURCEBOOKS

APNIEVE Sourcebook for Teacher Education and Tertiary Level Education. *Learning to Live Together in Peace and Harmony*, was published in 1998. The second Sourcebook, *Learning to Be: A Holistic and Integrated Approach to Values Education*, was launched in Adelaide South Australia in October 2002.

The third Sourcebook, *Learning to Do*, launched in Manila in March 2005, is now ready for use in technical-vocational schools and in the workplace. The fourth, *Learning to Know for a Sustainable and Peaceful Future*, was launched in China in 2009.

APNIEVE sourcebooks advocate an integral and holistic approach to education, in line with UNESCO's redefinition of quality education, focusing on the development of the whole person, including physical, intellectual, and emotional well being. The sourcebooks also introduce a values-education process and teaching methodology as part of the teaching-learning cycle applicable to any area of learning content, for an integrated approach to quality education towards a culture of peace.

Incorporation in accordance with the Corporation Code of the Philippines (Batas Pambansa Blg. 68)
and copies of its Articles and By-laws are hereto attached.

This Certificate grants juridical personality to the corporation but does not authorize it to
undertake business activities requiring a secondary license from this Commission such as but not
limited to acting as broker or dealer in securities, government securities eligible dealer (GSED),
investment adviser or sub-investment company, close end or open end investment company,
investment house, transfer agent, commodity financial futures exchange broker, merchant financing
company, pre-need plan issuer, general agent in pre-need plans and time deposit
share membership certificates issuer or selling agents thereof. Neither does this Certificate
constitute or permit to undertake activities for which other government agencies require a license or
permit.
