

The Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship by Japanese Grant Aid (JDS) announces its regular courses offered for Academic Year 2017. The features of the programs are as follows:

#### About the JDS Program

The Project for Human Resource Development by the Japanese Grant Aid (JDS) was established by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines with the assistance of the Government of Japan in 2002.

#### Objectives of the JDS

- Support for Human Resource Development in strengthening the government's
  administrative capacities in the Philippines, through providing the opportunity to obtain
  Master's degree for young capable government officials who are expected to be
  engaged in formulating and implementing social and economic development plans and
  play leadership roles to contribute to the development of the country, and
- Enhance Bilateral Relationships Filipino JDS participants are expected to contribute
  to expanding and enhancing the foundation for bilateral relations with Japan, utilizing
  the human network obtained through the academic and social activities, and experience
  in Japan.

#### 3. Beneficiaries of JDS

For the participants (JDS Fellows): JDS Fellows will acquire expertise to be used for
policy making and institutional building for the development of the country, and also
build human network in and out of Japan through the study in Japan;

- For the organizations (The Fellows' organizations): To attain a highly capable and motivated returnees (JDS Fellows) who can effectively contribute to the organizational missions; and
- For the country (the Fellows' country): To improve institutional capability of the target organizations which leads to foster the country's development.

#### 8. Award Benefits

The awards are offered for the minimum period necessary for an individual to complete the academic program specified by the JDS Project. The following benefits generally include:

- Full tuition fees
- Air fare
- Arrival Allowance
- Accommodation Allowance
- Monthly scholarship
- Subsidiary allowance for shipping
- Subsidiary allowance for travelling and seminar
- Overseas travel insurance
- Supports from the agent
  - -Finding accommodation
  - -Initial settlement of life in Japan
  - -Emergency situation, etc.

#### 9. Important JDS Rules

JDS has specific rules to realize its project goals and to secure study environment for the Fellows.

#### Before dispatched to Japan

 JDS Fellows must submit a JDS pledge to the Operating Committee to commit themselves to follow the JDS Rules.

#### During the stay in Japan

- The Fellows are allowed to bring their family members to Japan only three (3) months after the date of arrival in Japan.
- The Fellows are prohibited from:
  - Working
  - Driving motor vehicles, and
  - Applying for further studies such as doctoral course in Japan or any other countries

The Fellows must complete the study within the predetermined period of study, and return to his/her country soon after the completion of study.

#### After returning to home country

- The Fellows must attend a report meeting held by the Operating Committee.
- The Fellows are obliged to return to and work at the belonging organization for the respective numbers of years specified in the Scholarship Service Contract complying with the said contract.

# JDS Project in the Philippines (Component 1-1)

#### What is JDS?

was established in the Philippines in 2002 founded on the strong and lasting bilateral relations between the Philippines and Japan. The objective of the JDS is to support human resources development in the Philippines, targeting prospective young leaders who are engaged in the formulation and implementation of social and economic development policies. The JDS Fellows are expected to contribute to solving priority development issues of the Philippines as well as strengthening international cooperation and bilateral relations between the Philippines and Japan. The JDS Project is designed to contribute to strengthening institutional capacity of the Philippine government organization through individual official's capacity development.

#### Field of Study

The framework of the JDS Project consists of priority fields of studies in line with the priority development issues of the Philippines, categorized as "Sub-Program" and "Component." The JDS Fellows are selected from target organizations relevant to the Sub-Programs. Accepting Japanese universities offer 2-year Master's Degree programs (or 1-year Master's Degree Program at a university) related to the Components of the Sub-Program. All the classes will be taught
