B. MECHANICS OF THE ACTIVITIES

1. Library Henyo

How to join

- 1. The school principal will submit the names of the participant to Mr. Dennis M. Bautista on October 24 28, 2016 for registration.
- 2. Library Henyo is open to Grade 4, Grade 8, and Senior High School students.

Game Mechanics

- 1. Teams must have 2 players: Player One will guess the secret word/phrase and player two will respond to the Guesser by answering OO, Hindi, Pwede.
- 2. The secret word will be posted at the top of the head of player One.
- 3. The team will be given 3 minutes to guess the word / phrase.
- 4. No body language, no audience coaching. The team will be disqualified for this.
- 5. If "Player Two" answers with words other than oo, hindi, pwede, 5 seconds penalty shall be given to the team. It would be added to their end game. The computed end time would be the final result of their time.

- 6. The theme who reaches the maximum allowable time and did not guess the mystery word/phrase will be automatically eliminated.
- 7. The clock stops when Player One answers the secret word correctly.
- 8. The team with shortest time of guessing will be the winners. Winners will receive a certificate and token.
- 9. The Breaker: for the teams who have the same end time, they will be guessing another word. The team of guessing will be declared the winner.
- 2. On the Spot Poster Making Contest

How to Join

- 1. The school principal will submit the name of the participant to Mr. Dennis M. Bautista for registration on October 24 -28, 2016
- 2. The On the spot poster making contest is open to Grade 5, Grade 7, and Senior High School students.

Mechanics

- 1. The poster should be a visualization of the 2016 National Book Week Theme: Today's Readers: Inclusivity in Diversity".
- 2. Use white illustration board, 15" x 20 "in size.
- 3. Contestant may use any medium (craypas, water color, crayon, pentel pen, etc.)
- 4. The contestant's name and school must be written on a separate sheet of paper and stapled or attached at the back of the entry.
- 5. Contestant will be given 1 hour and 30 minutes to finish the activity.
- 6. The Judge will select best 3 winners.
- 7. The winners will be given certificate and token. Judging:
- 1. Entries will be judged by the Education supervisor in Mapeh.
- 2. Criteria for judging will be as follows:
 - Relevance to the theme 40 %
 - Creativity 25 %
 - Visual Impact 20 %
 - Originality 15 & Total of 100 %

3. On The Spot Essay Writing Contest

How to Join

- 1. The school principal will submit the name of the participant to Mr. Dennis M. Bautista at Library Hub on October 24-28, 2016.
- 2. The On the spot essay writing contest is open to Grade 6, Grade 9, and Senior High School students.

Mechanics

- 1. The theme of the essay will be the theme of the National Book Week 2016 celebration which is "Today's Readers: Inclusivity in Diversity".
- 2. The essay should be written in English, not be more than 300 words, handwritten.
- 3. Bring Mongol pencil.
- 4. The contestant's name and school must be written on a separate sheet of paper and staple or attached at the back of the entry.
- 5. The judges will select 3 winners.
- 6. The winning contestants will be given certificate and token.
- 7. The criteria for judging will be as follows:
 - Organization 35 %
 - Content 35 %
 - Mechanics 30 %
 Total of 100 %
