ANGELES CITY SAFEKIDS/FEDEX YOUNG ROAD SAFETY CHAMPION PROGRAM

TO: **Public Elementary School Heads of Angeles ES, Gueco Balibago ES, Jose P. Dizon ES, Sto. Rosario ES, Sta. Teresita ES.**

1. The Safe Kids Worldwide Philippines (SKWP) and Federal Express (FedEx) for school year 2015-2016, under the banner of the Walk This Way, the pedestrian safety program in coordination with the Department of Education, Division of Angeles City will conduct a training for the 5 beneficiary schools of SKP's Walk this Way Program on November 28, 2016 from 8am to 12nn at the Gabaldon Building, DepEd Division Of Angeles City.
2. Each beneficiary school of SKP's Walk this Way Program is requested to identify twelve (12) grade V student-participants to become champion educators of pedestrian safety in their school.
3. The selected students shall be accompanied by SKWP's Teacher Coordinator, GPTA President and Vice-President respectively.
4. Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with the Memorandum is desired.

Angeles City Safe Kids /FedEx Young Road Safety Champion Program

The Young Road Safety Advocate Champion Program (YRSACP) is an initiative of Safe Kids Philippines (SKP) and FedEx Express (FedEx) for Fiscal Year 17 and Fiscal Year 18 under the banner of the Walk This Way, the pedestrian safety program. The project will give a chance for Grade V students to be involved in the Walk This Way Program and will encourage participation of older students to teach the lower grades specifically to Grade IV through a "peer to peer" education approach. The peer to peer education will increase the knowledge of Grade IV students on pedestrian safety in the beneficiary cities of Safe Kids/FedEx's Walk This Way Program. Training on pedestrian safety will be provided to Grade V students by SKP and/or Coalition partners through a partnership with the Department of Education (DepEd) and the local government units (LGUs).

At the end of the project, it is expected that the Safe Kids /FedEx Young Road Safety Champions will have a pool of advocates among the Grade V students who can demonstrate and communicate their knowledge on pedestrian safety to younger students through education.

Mechanics:

1. Identify twelve (12) grade five students from each school of six (6) beneficiary schools of SKP's Walk This Way Program ;
2. Organize and train these students to become champion educators of pedestrian safety in each school on November 29, 2016 (Tuesday) headed by the Heograpiya, Kasaysayan at Sibika (HEKASI) Head teacher (attached WTW hand outs);
2. HEKASI Head Teachers will assign the trained Grade V students to teach pedestrian safety by giving assignments from one to three classes of Grade IV in their own schools on December 1, 2016 (Thursday);
3. From January 26 - 27, 2017 (Thursday & Friday), the pedestrian safety education activity for Grade IV will be given by the trained Grade V students on pedestrian safety in the classroom. The little teachers (Grade V) assigned to give classes to lower grades (Grades IV) are expected to first give the pre tests to the lower grades before going on to the road safety lesson proper;

Before the pedestrian safety session ends, post tests should be given to the Grades IV students to know if there is an increase of knowledge on pedestrian safety;

FedEx volunteers can join the Grade V students in session by leading the games for Walk This Way Program. FedEx will not only be able to show the support to the Grade V students but will also have the chance to work with them.

4. The trained grade five (5) students have the chance to showcase their creativity on executing the pedestrian safety education by using their own techniques and innovations based on the curriculum of WTW;
5. At the end, the Grade five (5) students can be recognized by their schools as Safe Kids /FedEx Young Road Safety Champions ;
6. On February 3, 2017 (Friday), one whole page short bond paper report with fifteen (15) minute video should be submitted to **Mr. Ramil Dacanay**, Education Supervisor of Schools Division Office. These reports in turn will be submitted to SKWP at #27 Fourth St. St. Ignatius Village Brgy. St. Ignatius, Quezon City from February 28, 2017 to March 3, 2017 with the number of Grade V students who attended the training, number of Grade IV who attended the pedestrian classroom teachings and lastly the number of teachers who joined the Safe Kids /FedEx Young Road Safety Champion Program.
