CONDUCT OF REMEDIAL CLASSES AND 2016 SUMMER CLASSES

TO: OIC-Assistant Schools Division Superintendent
Chiefs, CID and SGOD
Education Program Supervisors
Public Schools District Supervisors
Public Elementary and Secondary School Heads/OICs

1. With reference to the Policy Guidelines on Classroom Assessment for the K to 12 Basic Education Program in DepED Order No. 8, s. 2015, Paragraph D, which states that **"For Grades 1 – 10, a learner who Did not meet Expectations in at most two (2) learning areas must take remedial classes. Remedial Classes are conducted after the Final Grades have been computed. The learner must pass the remedial classes to be promoted to the next grade level."**

2. a) For School Year 2015 – 2016, the division will allow the schools to conduct Remedial Classes from March 28 to April 8, 2016.

b) Summer Classes may also be conducted on April 11 to May 21, 2016, pursuant to DepED Order No. 9, s. 2015, public secondary schools which will offer 2016 Summer Classes must follow the implementing guidelines in the Holding of Summer Classes.

(Note: Irregular students (students with back subjects in the previous grade levels) are advised to take summer class/es.

3. The School Head may design a class program for the Remedial Class/es where the number of hours daily per subject will depend on the learning competencies failed by the child.

4. Guidelines on Computation of Remedial Class Mark is reflected also in DepED Order No. 8, s. 2015, paragraph D.

5. a) In exigency of the service, the subject teachers who gave a failing mark to pupils/students shall be requested to teach during the conduct of Remedial Classes to help students/pupils improve their level of proficiency.

b) The teacher will be given one (1) day service credit for every eight (8) hours of actual teaching rendered during the Remedial Class.

6. School Heads are requested to submit to the Office of the OIC-Assistant Schools Division Superintendent the: 1) List of students with the subject they failed, 2) names of teachers who will teach Remedial Class and 3) Class Program.

7. Immediate dissemination and compliance to the contents of this memorandum is earnestly desired.
