Greetings from Bayan Academy!

Bayan Academy, in partnership with the Department of Education, Rex Book Store, Knowledge Channel Foundation and ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, is pleased to announce the start of the **6th Excellence in Educational Transformation Awards (EETA)** - a search for innovators in education. The Award recognizes the innovative efforts of the country's elementary and secondary schools in transforming themselves into pillars of learning effectiveness and school efficiency.

For the 6th EETA, the Areas of Innovation recognized by the EETA are the following:

- Innovations in Quality Education
 - Curriculum Design and Development
 - Learning Materials
 - Learning Methodologies and Delivery Systems
 - Education for the 21st Century
- Innovations in Learning Environment
 - Learning Spaces and Places
 - Child Safety, Security and Sensitivity
- Innovations in Access to Education
- Innovations in Leadership, Governance and Management

In addition to the Top Award for a school, we are also giving recognition to an education leader, who has been in the forefront of transformative programs in schools, districts or divisions, with the OML Award for Educational Leadership. Details of the program can be found in the accompanying brochure.

For the past years, 32 schools have been recognized and had been generous in sharing their transformative innovations with us. Given your thrust in promoting quality education, may we invite and encourage you to endorse the EETA to your governing schools and submit their application to the EETA as together we strive to change the landscape of Philippine education. We hope that the 6th EETA

program will fully merit your participation. Deadline for submission of applications is **on October 31, 2018.**

In the 5th EETA, two DepEd divisions and one public school were awarded in this prestigious award. These were the DepEd Carcar's Two Subjects, One Day (2SOD) approach which led them to develop more appropriate learning materials by the teachers who took more active role in the learning process. These independent learning materials were utilized by the students to work on their own.

The second division was DepEd Camiguin which was recognized for their Open High School Program that enabled students to learn without physically going to school every day with flexible schedules. The pace of education was altered as individual students worked on their self-learning modules in their own time wherein grading and reporting system was also revised and may take six years to finish high school. Alternative delivery modes also include the Mobile Open High School, a community based program that went beyond education "anytime, anywhere."

One small public school was recognized in faraway remote barangay in Lawit, Gingoog Misamis Oriental. With limited faculty to teach the 112 students, the school came up with an innovative program called IMPACT: Instructional Management by Parents, Community and Teachers which involved the entire village to participate in activities attractive to both parents and students alike. IMPACT's instructional supervisors were the teachers who were assigned to families who were related to one another for easier coordination. Students who were academically capable and willing to teach specific subjects to peer groups were named programmed teachers. Peer groups had leaders who guided their classmates and students a grade lower than them. This innovation significantly reduced absences and drop-out rates, and improved the school's National Aptitude Test scores.
