- 1. In compliance with DepEd Memorandum No. 048, s. 2021 titled "2021 BRIGADA ESKWELA IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINE", this Office announces the Division Search for the 2021 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools under the Covid-19 pandemic.
- The Division Search aims to:
 - Recognize schools' exemplary effort in the implementation of Brigada Eskwela under Covid-19 pandemic; and
 - Recognize schools' partnership engagement with various stakeholders to support
 the implementation of BE-LCOP in ensuring that quality basic education is provided
 to the learners despite the challenges of the pandemic.
- 3. Since all schools are **PROHIBITED** from conducting physical activities (face-to-face) that involve volunteers or stakeholders in their respective schools due to the rising cases of Covid-19, a set of contextualized guidelines on the Division Search for the Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools is hereby enclosed.
- 4. Kindly refer to DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 "Updated Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers" for further details on granting service credits.

5. Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance to the contents of this Memorandum is earnestly desired.

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CONTEXTUALIZED DIVISION GUIDELINES ON THE SEARCH FOR 2021 BEST BRIGADA ESKWELA IMPLEMENTING SCHOOLS IN TIMES COVID-19 PANDEMIC

- 1. Considering the schools are used as venues in preparation of the Learning Activity Sheets (LAS) and its digital copies, including the picking up and returning of the same by the parents, physical cleaning and disinfection may be allowed during the two (2) weeks before the opening of classes depending on the prevailing local risks classification and community quarantine guidelines. If allowed, the schools shall strictly comply with the protocols mandated by the IATF, DOH, and local quarantine rules and all relevant protocols provided by the DepEd and DepEd Task Force Covid-19 issuances.
- 2. Below is the Division Selection and Evaluation Committee list for the Division Search for the 2021 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools. The committee shall do document evaluation and validation online. Incomplete submission of the required documents and prescribed means of verification (MOVs) will not be accepted as an official entry. The result of the selection and evaluation is final and irrevocable.

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- 3. The search shall be in two stages, to wit:
 - Document Evaluation
 The Division Selection and Evaluation Committee shall determine qualifiers in each category to be considered for online validation.
 - b. Online Validation The Division Selection and Evaluation Committee shall validate the qualified schools' documents per category to determine the division winner for Division Search for the 2021 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools.
- 4. The categories are as follows:

 The Division Search for 2021 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools in times of Covid-19 pandemic shall be selected and evaluated in accordance with the following contextualized selection criteria:

A. Brigada Eskwela Partnership Engagement- 40%

This pertains to the kind/impact of resources provided by the stakeholder, which may be measured in the percentage (%) of the actual number of learners/teachers/non-teaching personnel who benefitted from the resources. The actual score is divided by the highest possible score then the quotient shall be multiplied by 40%.

Means of Verification (MOVs): may include but not limited to: Approved Partnership Proposal by the School Head signed by the stakeholder/partner, Attendance form who benefited to the partnership with contact number and or email address (if applicable), Deed of Donations and Acceptance, MOA/MOU and other relevant documents/evidence for this criterion.

As stipulated in the DepEd Memorandum No. 048 s. 2021, the pre-pandemic concept of Brigada Eskwela, which involves physical cleaning, painting, repainting, and doing minor repairs, will not still happen this year's Brigada Eskwela implementation.

Means of Verification (MOVs): may include but not limited to MOA/MOU, Acknowledgement Receipts, Official Receipts, Deed of Donations, Certificate of Acceptance, and Approved request letters to the external stakeholders.

C. Bayanihan effort to support the BE-LCOP implementation-30%

This shall reflect the impact of the Brigada Eskwela in terms of community participation and level of awareness on education programs. This shall also include the response of the community in making conducive learning spaces at homes and the partnership initiate for literacy and numeracy.

Implementation of Brigada Pagbasa Program (Literacy and Numeracy) in partnership with the following stakeholders:

In partnership with the school, the identified stakeholder shall implement the Literacy and Numeracy Program or donations that complement DepEd's effort to provide accessible, safe, and quality education to support implementing the Basic Education-Learning Continuity Plan (BE-LCOP). The total score is divided by the highest possible score then the quotient shall be multiplied by 50%.

Means of Verification (MOVs): may include but not limited to MOA/MOU, Approved Project Proposal by the School Head, Signed Accomplishment Report, Deed of Donations, Deed of Acceptance Pictures with annotations of the daily conduct of the program, Approved request letters to the external stakeholders, Approved Partnership Proposal, Attendance Sheet with contact number and or email address.
